## About the Peel Regional Police Scholarship

The Peel Regional Police Scholarship supports graduating secondary school students in Brampton and Mississauga who show leadership, community involvement, and a strong commitment to inclusion and diversity.

The scholarship is funded through proceeds raised from the annual Race Against Racism event and supports students beginning post-secondary education at a recognized Canadian college or university in September 2026.

This scholarship recognizes students who help build safe, welcoming, and inclusive communities.

## How to Apply and Submit

### Step 1: Prepare Your Application

Students must apply by submitting a complete application package.

Your application package must include:

- A completed application form
- One reference letter from an adult who knows you well
- Proof of acceptance or enrollment in a Canadian college or university (starting September 2026)

### Step 2: Submit Your Application

Submit your completed application package before **11:59 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 4, 2026.**

## Eligibility

You can apply if you:

- Live in Brampton or Mississauga
- Attend a secondary school in Brampton or Mississauga
- Are graduating with an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) in June 2026
- Plan to attend a Canadian college or university in September 2026
- Show leadership, community involvement, and respect for people from different backgrounds

## Selection Criteria

Applications will be reviewed based on:

- Leadership and initiative (25 per cent)
- Community involvement (25 per cent)
- Inclusion and diversity impact (25 per cent)
- Essay quality and reflection (25 per cent)

- Volunteer supervisor

The letter should describe your:

- Character
- Leadership
- Community involvement
- Contributions to inclusion and diversity

## 6. Supporting Documents

You may also be asked to provide:

- Proof of graduation (if required)
- Additional verification documents if requested
